# From my heart to yours:



As we approach Memorial Day once again, it seems appropriate to recall the story of the four chaplains who sacrificed their lives for others during World War II.

It was February 3, 1943, and the U. S. Army Transport Dorchester was in a convoy making its way across the Atlantic to an American base in Greenland. The Dorchester, a converted luxury liner, was filled to capacity with 902 servicemen, merchant seamen, and civilian workers. The convoy was 150 miles from its destination.

Shortly after midnight, an officer on a German submarine spotted the Dorchester and gave orders to fire. The hit was decisive, striking the ship well below the water line. The initial blast killed scores of men and injured others. Panic set in as men were screaming and crying as they hurried in the cold and darkness to the deck to board lifeboats.

Throughout the pandemonium, four men calmed the frightened, aided the wounded, and guided the disoriented to safety. They were four chaplains, Lt. George Fox (a Methodist); Lt. Alexander Goode (a Jewish Rabbi); Lt. John Washington (a Catholic Priest); and Lt. Clark Poling (a Dutch Reformed Minister).

On deck, the chaplains opened a storage locker and distributed life jackets. Those nearby witnessed an amazing sight. When there were no more life jackets to hand out, the four chaplains simultaneously removed their jackets and gave them to four frightened young men.

When giving up their lifejackets, Rabbi Goode did not call out for a Jew; Father Washington did not call out for a Catholic; nor did Fox or Poling call out for Protestants. They gladly gave their life jackets to the next men in line. A survivor later testified, "It was the finest thing I have seen or ever hope to see this side of heaven."

As the ship went down, survivors in nearby rafts watched the four chaplains—arms linked and braced against the slanting deck.

Their voices could be heard offering prayers and singing hymns. Of the 902 men aboard the Dorchester, only 230 survived.

Before boarding the ship back in January, Chaplain Clark Poling had asked his father, Daniel Poling, to pray for him. His request was this: "Do not pray for my safe return. That wouldn't be fair. Just pray that I will do my duty, never be a coward, have strength and courage, and that I shall be adequate."

Dr. Daniel Poling, later Editor of <u>Christianity</u> <u>Today</u>, commented, "The only prayer Clark wanted answered was indeed answered—that he would be adequate."

The four chaplains appropriately were acknowledged with the Distinguished Service Cross and Purple Heart.

Jesus said: "Greater love has no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends" (John 15:13).

### **NEW BOOKS:**

Where We Belong by Lynn Austin - - In the city of Chicago in 1892, the rules for Victorian women are strict, their roles limited. But sisters Rebecca and Flora Hawes are not typical Victorian ladies. Their love of adventure and their desire to use their God-given talents has brought them to the Sinai Desert--and into a sandstorm. Accompanied by Soren Petersen, their somber young butler, and Kate Rafferty, a street urchin who is learning to be their ladies' maid, the two women are on a quest to find an important Biblical manuscript. As the journey becomes more dangerous and uncertain, the four travelers sift through memories of their past, recalling the events that shaped them and the circumstances that brought them to this time and place.

<u>If I Were You</u> by Lynn Austin - A gripping historical fiction story of friendship and survival set in London during WWII and Post-War America.

<u>The Prophet</u> by Francine Rivers - The Israelites rebelled against God and were devoured by war. But first, they were warned by **Amos**, a prophet who refused to turn away. Be challenged by this faithful man whose story we must never forget.

<u>The Love Letter</u> by Rachel Hauck - A melding of two timelines into an unforgettable story. It isn't what readers will be expecting, but it will be what readers need. Themes of redemption, love, sacrifice and loyalty resonate throughout.

<u>The Dog Who Was There</u> by Ron Marasco - No one expected Barley the dog to have an encounter with the Messiah. He was homeless, hungry, and struggling to survive in first century Jerusalem. Most surprisingly, he was a dog. But through Barley's eyes, the story of a teacher from Galilee comes alive in a way we've never experienced before. Be prepared to laugh, cry, and be amazed at what Barley experiences.
