

Moving Forward in Faith and Commitment



As funds then become available, this new building project will be followed by Phase 2, the remodeling of the existing Office/Education Building to provide needed Sunday School space. This Sunday School space will be close to the Sanctuary for convenience and ease of movement on Sunday mornings.

The church also approved further study of the other Master Plan phases, which include a new Gathering Area Atrium and a new Choir Suite, with the understanding that any plans for these future projects will be approved by the Church.

In Business Meeting on June 14, the Church named a Space Planning Design Team to work with Rik Sowell Architects of Conway, Arkansas. Rik has specialized in church building projects and is previously known to our Church. Currently, he serves as the architect for the new building at Balboa Baptist Church. The Design Team includes Alan Farrow, Chair, Tom Belin, Tony Gaston, and Tom Hensley. Members of the Church Staff also are working closely with the team.

As a result of comments received during the forum sessions leading up to the vote on the Master Plan, the Church has also elected a Current Needs Task Force to join with the Building and Grounds Team to address immediate building and facility needs not included in the Space Study Master Plan recommendations. Members of this Task Force are Anna Cogswell, Sue Farrow, Elton Gray, Kaye Leeper, and Bettye Jo Thrash. Members of the Building and Grounds Team include Tony Gaston, Chair, Shelvie Scales, Fred Smith. James Roberts, Building and

Grounds Supervisor, will work closely with this group to identify and make recommendations regarding the beautification and up-keep of our buildings.

FLYERS PROMOTING UBS are available at the church. Do your part by passing them out and encourage children to attend.



MONEY MANAGEMENT

Dr. Bob Hartsell, Consumer Financial Advocate, has written a series of articles to help us learn ways to keep more of the money we have coming in. As space permits, we are going to share these with our readers.

STOP YOUR HOME INSURANCE MONEY DRAIN

If you're like most Americans, you are swapping a neat retirement nest egg for home insurance protection you don't need.

If you invested \$30 a month for forty years (age 25-65) at 4%, you'd have \$35,459. If you spent only the interest each year after that, you'd have \$1,418 to supplement your retirement.

Change Your Thinking

When it comes to insurance, many people think this way: If I have a loss, I want the insurance company to pay for everything. If I have to pay their premiums, I want them to pay all of my bills.

The insurance companies love this line of thinking. It means higher premiums and more profits for them.

Most homeowners would come out ahead financially if they thought, *How can I get adequate protection for the least money?*

Homeowners who think this way usually can find at least seven ways to protect their wallets against insurers.

Don't Insure the Lot

Most agents ask what you paid for your house. When you answer, they ask if you want to insure your home for that amount.

Most homeowners say yes. But they forget that they didn't pay just for the house. They paid for the real estate (land) with all improvements thereon.

The most inept fire department in the country never lost a lot! Insure your house. Don't insure your lot.

Raise Your Deductible

The deductible is the amount you pay before your insurer pays anything.

If you invest the savings in premiums between \$1000 deductible and \$250 deductible coverage, you'll soon have enough money to pay the \$1000 deductible should you ever have a loss. And most homeowners never do!

Paying higher premiums for lower deductible is spending money for something you'll most likely never use.

Raise your deductible and invest the premium dollars you save. That can supplement your retirement.

Duplicate Coverages

You probably have medical coverage on your family. Why do you need medical coverage on your homeowners policy? To protect against injury to others? What's your liability coverage for?

You can pay two premiums, but you can't collect duplicate benefits!

Replacement Value

Most companies provide full replacement coverage if your house is insured for 80% of its value. You don't have to pay higher premiums to cover it for 100% of value.

This is one time you can get 100% for the price of 80%.

Unnecessary Coverages

Insurance companies collect premiums for coverages they provide, whether or not you need them. Their purpose is to make as much money as possible.

Your purpose is to get desired protection at the most economical cost. Check your coverage and save your dollars.

Uncovered Items

This won't lower your premiums, but it could save dollars if you have a loss: Some items are not covered in a standard policy. You need a special rider or the company won't pay. Ask your agent.

Rates Not Uniform

Many homeowners assume that all insurers charge identical rates. Not true. Decide what coverages you want then ask for quotations on coverage from at least three companies. Shop for the best insurance values the same way you shop for groceries, clothes, and cars. You'll be money ahead.
