From my heart to yours:

In November, 2015 a demographic study was conducted to look at projected population trends within



five miles of Barcelona Road Baptist Church. The study concluded that net growth for our church could be at least 100 people during the next 5 to 10 years. At the same time, our church does not have sufficient Sunday School space to meet this need. Currently, all available classrooms are being used and some classes are almost filled to capacity. Wisely, the church elected a Space Study Committee to recommend a long-range Master Plan

In August, 2016 the committee brought several areas of consideration to the church for further study by a professional architectural engineering firm. A fee of \$5,000 was approved to support this effort. The architectural firm presented its findings in January, 2017. Since then, the committee has reviewed the various options and costs.

The committee presented its report and recommendations on Wednesday, May 10. Follow up forum periods were held on May 21 and 24. The committee is grateful for the input by the congregation. A vote on the Master Plan by secret ballot will take place at the end of Morning Worship on June 4.

The Master Plan includes four phases over a multi-year period. **Phase 1** is the construction of a free standing Office/Administration Building at an approximate cost of \$538,500. The good news is that the church already has \$550,000 in hand for this project.

Phase 2 is the remodeling of our existing Educational Building to provide needed Sunday School space. This project will be done as funds are available. The estimated cost for this work is \$30,000 to \$70,000, depending on the extent of the renovation. Current office space will be turned into classrooms, thus locating them near the Sanctuary.

Phases 3 and 4 include a new Gathering Area Atrium connected to our current Sanctuary vestibule and a new Choir Suite. The church has had plans for the Choir Suite since 2010. The committee recognizes that these last two phases are down the road a ways and will require careful study and generous giving. Of course, church approval will be required.

As part of its study, the committee acknowledges the need for a canopy from the parking lot to the Sanctuary door on the west side. The estimated cost is \$5,000 to \$10,000. This project could be completed at any time.

Our church needs a Master Plan for the future. God would have us fulfill the Great Commission by being a church for all ages. Certainly, we will continue to attract retirees who move to the Village. What about younger families who in great numbers are making their homes inside the west gate? They are at our doorstep.

God has blessed us with a vision and resources. In the words of William Carey, the great missionary, let us "expect great things from God; attempt great things for God."
