

Thanksgiving

The day before Thanksgiving an older man in Phoenix called his son in New York and said to him, "I hate to ruin your day, but I have to tell you that your mother and I are getting a divorce. Forty-eight years of misery is enough. We are sick of each other, and so you should call your sister in Chicago and tell her."

Frantic, the son called his sister, who exploded on the phone. "No way are they getting divorced," she shouted. "I'll take care of this." She called Phoenix immediately, and said to her father, "You are NOT getting divorced. Don't do anything until my brother and I get there tomorrow. Do you hear me?" The man hung up the phone and turned to his wife, "Okay, honey. The kids are coming for Thanksgiving and they are paying for their flights!"

Thanksgiving is about family gatherings. It is also about taking time to express our gratitude to God. Benjamin Franklin recalled an experience from his boyhood. He told about the old salt barrel that stood in the corner of the kitchen. Meat was taken from the barrel daily to provide for the family's needs. Franklin's father prayed before every meal, "Thank Thee, Father, for the meat thou hast laid before us." One day young Ben managed enough courage to suggest: "Father, why don't we say thanks over the whole barrel at one time and be done with it?" Franklin commented years later that he would never forget the stern rebuke of his father for such presumptuous ingratitude.

Thanksgiving comes once each year. We dump the blessings of 364 days into one Thanksgiving Day and piously express our gratitude to the Lord. 
The first week there was spent assisting with a Children's Camp and the second week they helped with a construction project.

Phil and Theresa Clay have lived in the Village since April. They found Barcelona Road Baptist by doing an internet search.

Phil is an ordained minister and has served 17 years as a missionary to Latin America, Costa Rica, southern Texas and northern Mexico. He worked with CAM International (now known as CAMINO Global), an organization which works with Spanish speaking people.

Phil and Theresa are faith-based missionaries. They are called by God to serve the Spanish-speaking Quichua Indians and others in northern Ecuador, and will be working there through the City on a Hill Missions organization.

They hope to leave in a few days for Cotacachi, Ecuador, a small village high in the northern Andes Mountains, and to minister to the Spanish-speaking Quichua Indians and Mestizo people.

Phil says BRBC family members can pray for them as they go, that both of them will be able to preach the gospel to receptive hearts, and that they will stay healthy as they travel and minister to others.

If church members request to be their friends on Facebook, Phil and Theresa will also add you to their private Facebook group for their immediate mission updates and prayer requests.

The Clays are able to provide part of their own financial support but trust God to provide the rest through monthly donations from churches and interested Christians, Phil said. They are not part of a denominational mission board such as IMB.

"Faith-based" missionaries present their ministries to U.S. churches and trust God to raise up a base of monthly supporters who will commit to sending a monthly donation to their agency, he added. The agency provides the missionaries a salary, based on the donations received each month, and each sending agency sets a minimum salary that the missionary must raise.

"We are trying to get to the mission field quicker and, therefore, are trying to fund the majority of our support from our own funds," Phil explained. "But we still have monthly financial needs that can be met through tax-deductible donations to City on a Hill Missions."
