# MAY **MEMORY VERSE**

"But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.

~Matthew 6:33, KJV

## From my heart to yours:

#### May I Be Excused?

Let's look at some "copouts" or excuses related to church. First, people say, "There are hypocrites in the church, so that is why I don't attend." This is a lame excuse! We don't talk about hypocrites at the office, in the schools, or in the stores. We don't let hypocrites in Hollywood keep us from movies, or hypocrites in sports keep us from going to ball games. Edgar A. Guest wrote: "Men often sneeringly besmirch the hypocrites that go to church. Yet, no one has a word to say, of hypocrites who stay away." Of course, there are hypocrites in the church. But we are not to measure ourselves by others. Paul wrote, "So then every one of us shall give account of himself to God" (Romans 14:12).

Second, people say, "You don't have to belong to a church to be a Christian." This statement may be true, but is it reasonable? Yes, you can be a rose without a bush, but you won't last long. You can be a hot coal without a fire, but your warmth will soon grow cold. The church is our lifeline. It is our support system. A preacher tells about the time he came upon a stalled car. An old man and two boys were trying to push it up a hill. His conscience reasoned, "I should stop and help them. This is an opportunity for service." Another voice protested, "It's none of your business. You'll get hot and dirty helping them." Nevertheless, he stopped and helped. Afterward, the old man stuck out his hand and said, "I am so glad you came along. Your strength added to ours was just enough to get the car going." Every person is important in the life of the church. We need each other as well. The writer of Hebrews counsels, "Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is" (Hebrews 10:25).

Third, folks complain, "The church is always asking for money. Every time I go, they expect me to give." Now it is true that some unscrupulous religious leaders and organizations try to "fleece their flocks." But most local churches are responsible in their stewardship. It is ironic that some who complain about the church and giving gladly pay to attend sporting events and concerts. They regularly pay for roads and schools and health benefits. They shop in malls, bid at auctions, and pay restaurants for the privilege of eating. They know nothing is really free.

A man sat quietly in the business meeting of his church and listened as one member after another stood to speak against a worthy fundraising project. Finally, he spoke. "Brothers and sisters, I just want to say this. Years ago, a little boy was born into our family. From the moment he came he cost us something. We paid for food, clothes, medicine, toys, and a little cocker spaniel puppy. When he went to school, there were more expenses. There were books and supplies and fees and swimming lessons. Later when he went to college, we had to get a loan to pay his tuition." The man paused to clear his throat. He continued, "Then, one day he died, and since then he hasn't cost us a cent." Anything worthwhile costs something. "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35).

Finally, some people say, "I don't need the church or to consider spiritual things, because I've got plenty of time." This is not a valid excuse, because life is short. We are never certain about tomorrow. The Epistle of James talks about first century business men who made their marketing plans confident they could control the future. They were reminded, however, that life is like a mist that appears briefly and then vanishes away. (James 4:13-14). Indeed, life is short, and we must make the most of it!

We wish Jax God's speed and pray for his continued academic success.


