## From my heart to yours:

Making mistakes is one of the most embarrassing things we do, especially if we make them in front of a lot of people. Television shows consistently draw high ratings when they reveal the “bloopers” of ordinary folks as they go about their daily lives.



Sports bloopers are funny when they are caught on camera. When José Canseco was playing for the Texas Rangers, he raced back to the wall to catch a fly ball in right field. Unfortunately, his timing was off. He missed catching the ball, the ball hit him on the head, and then bounced over the wall for a home run. A football video shows a Pittsburgh Steeler receiver spiking the ball five yards short of the goal line. On another occasion a quarterback lined up under the guard instead of the center for the snap.

Bloopers also occur in church. I heard about a group of women walking into the sanctuary for the worship service. One intended to say, “Where shall we sit today?” Instead, she said, “Where shall we sleep today?” To make matters worse, one of the women she said it to was the pastor’s wife!

A pastor friend tells about the time a staff member welcomed the visitors in a Texas church where he served. The welcome went something like this: “My wife and I are delighted to have house guests this weekend visiting from a former church. They are some of our dearest friends. I’m so sorry, but I have forgotten their names.”

Years ago when I was pastor in Louisville, our morning worship was broadcast live on the CBS affiliate. After baptizing several candidates, I hurried out of the baptistry and back to the pulpit for the welcome time. A deacon sitting on the front row noticed my dilemma and signaled a message to the Associate Pastor on the platform.

As I finished my welcome from behind the pulpit and asked the congregation to greet one another, the well-meaning Associate Pastor slipped up behind me and whispered, “Pastor, you need to zip up your pants.” Fortunately the house microphone was off, but the broadcast mike on my lapel was still on. On cue, around 30,000 television viewers watched as I zipped up my pants. Now that is an unforgettable blooper!

The truth is that we all are guilty of “bloopers” or more serious mistakes and wrongs. The good news is that God is patient and forgiving when we fail. After Jonah attempted to run away from God, the text states, “And the word of the Lord came to Jonah the second time” (Jonah 3:1). Jonah was given another chance. Peter also was given another opportunity to serve after he had denied Jesus. Jesus commissioned him, “Feed my sheep” (John 21:17).

We also need to be more patient with each other when we falter and fail. The Lord’s Prayer reminds us to pray, “Forgive us our debts as we also have forgiven our debtors” (Matthew 6:12). As we have been forgiven, we should be willing to forgive others.
