From My Heart to Yours

Defining Success

How do you define success? For many people today the answer is expressed in the words possessions, prestige, position, and power. These four p's constitute the popular definition of success.

According to popular opinion, a successful person is one who holds the best job, oversees the most employees, and commands the largest salary. This person wears fashionable clothes, drives a luxury automobile, lives in the best part of town, and belongs to exclusive clubs.

We live in a success-oriented society. Consider the how-to-do-it programs on television. These programs are designed to promote the good life, to help people become financially independent, and to demonstrate how to rise to the top. I saw one persuasive personality on the tube who promised to make viewers millionaires if they followed his formula for success. Of course, he demanded a generous fee before he would share his expertise. In a weak moment, I was almost tempted to accept his offer!

Frankly, we all want to be successful. The desire to be somebody is a dominant impulse in human nature. The drum major syndrome is very much with us, but we must be careful how we view success. The popular definition is humanistic in orientation. It fails to include God and ignores the important spiritual dimension of life.

Jesus' definition of success was radically different from the world's understanding. James and John discovered this long ago when they sought positions of power in Jesus' coming kingdom. Jesus radically redefined success. Success is not holding a position or exercising power. Success comes from serving others rather than seeing greatness for ourselves. A successful person is one who climbs to the bottom in order to serve. Jesus was the supreme example of a successful person. He lived for others; and died for others. He came "not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many" (Mark 10:45).

Paul described the servant spirit, the secret of success, in his letter to the Philippians. He urged, "Do nothing from selfishness or conceit, but in humility count others better than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others" (Philippians 3:3-5).

LIBRARY NEWS


