

Vacation Bible School

It is almost June and time for Vacation Bible School. The dates are June 10-14 from 9:00 AM until noon. Shelly Wagner is Director of our Bible School. She is assisted by Ann Webb, David Robinson, and a host of volunteers. If you are willing to serve, call Shelly or the church office.

Almost every street in our end of the Village has families with young children. Do you have children living near you? Take the time to invite them to VBS. Better yet, get permission from their parents to bring them.

I grew up in Fayetteville, Arkansas. My family faithfully attended First Baptist Church. Some of my fondest memories are related to experiences in Vacation Bible School. I remember the songs we sang, the Scriptures we learned, the games we played, and the refreshments we enjoyed (sometimes ice cream or watermelon). New Office Building and Renovation of Current Space

Our contractor is projecting that our new Office Building will be ready by the end of July. Some furnishings will be moved from the current offices, while others will need to be purchased. At the same time, our Building and Grounds Team and Church Staff are working on the renovation plans for our current office space. Some walls will be moved to make room for Sunday School classes. Our goal has been to provide class space as near to the Sanctuary as possible. Decisions about where classes will be located will be made by the Building and Grounds Team, the Church Staff, and Sunday School Directors.

The good news is that we will enter the new building debt free. In addition, we currently have \$11,000 in hand for our renovation efforts.

Don't miss this opportunity to spend time with this outstanding man of God.




Children's Camp for children who have completed 3rd through 6th grades is June 23-26. The group will depart the church on Sunday afternoon and return Wednesday afternoon.

Are you thirsty? Chances are, you are already dehydrated! The body needs water to function properly as it is made up of 60% water. Just to maintain hydration, the average person needs 1500 mL of water daily (this equates to approximately 64 ounces or 2 quarts of water a day) regardless of the outdoor temperatures. Your body requires more if you are in the hot outdoors. Excessive alcohol or caffeine intake can escalate dehydration. Dehydration can lead to numerous medical problems, including urinary tract infections, so take care in the summer months ahead! Drink sips of water throughout the day.

Signs/Symptoms of dehydration:

* Dry throat, thirst, lack of tears, decreased perspiration, no urination (or dark-colored urine), dizziness, fatigue, muscle cramps, mental confusion, and craving water.

BUILDING PROGRESS



As you see from the photo, our new administration building is taking shape quickly. Inside electrical and data conduit has been installed, roof insulation completed, the front and back steps completed along with the new ADA ramp to the front steps. The main entrance door along with the windows have been installed, the three air conditioning systems with duct work installed except for the condensing units and final drops to ceiling grills after the suspended system is completed.


The interior wall board installation is underway, the cabinet and counter top contractor has been on site taking measurements and will submit shop drawings along with color samples for paint and counter tops very soon. Likewise, the ramp and stair rail contractor has been on site taking measurements for our custom made railing to match the existing church railings. There is only one major parking lot dig required to be scheduled and that is for the sewer line connection out to grinder pump on Barcelona Road.


Meantime, Church Administrator Betty Belin has been working to switch over our voice and data service to Suddenlink who will connect our contractor's installation with their service.

Our general contractor, Moser Construction, LLC goal is to hopefully complete all work and turn the building over to us during July.

At this time, funding for our project is on track within our approved guideline. Change orders due to unexpected field conditions have been minimal and value engineering to keep costs on par or lower is an on-going activity.
