We are deeply grateful for this generous, anonymous gift.

The speaker for this month's Men's Ministry is Dr. Dean Lee of the Village. Lee was a three sport high school standout—basketball, baseball, and tennis—at Berryville, Arkansas. After high school he played basketball, baseball and tennis for the Reddies at Henderson State University, where he received his Bachelor and Master's degrees. Later, he earned his doctorate from the University of Arkansas. He played in two national championship games as a member of HSU's basketball team.

After graduation Lee coached high school basketball and then moved to higher education, where he worked for over 25 years. He was Athletic Director at AR Tech University and AR State University, Associate Director of Athletics for External Operations at Oklahoma State University, and vice president of the University of Arkansas Razorback Foundation. He guided athletic departments to annual success both academically and competitively. Lee ended his career as the executive director of alumni and constituent relations in the Division of Institutional Advancement at UAMS.

During his tenure at Arkansas State University, Lee hired Gus Malzahon as the University Head Football Coach and John Brady, former LSU head Basketball Coach, as the Red Wolves Head Basketball Coach. The 2008 AAFF's Outstanding Athletic Director served on the NCAA Men's Basketball Issues Committee, the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) Athletic Directors Advisory Committee, and the Division Athletic Directors Association Board of Trustees.

Dr. Lee will be sharing how he was able to share his faith while being involved in "Big Time" collegiate athletics.

HEART BEAT



Have you ever been prescribed antibiotics and heard "take it until it's all gone, even if you start to feel better"? Well, there's a good reason for that!

Most people take partial amounts of prescriptions and have the mindset, "I'll save some for later for when I feel bad again". HUGE mistake! What you're actually doing is raising your body's resistance to the antibiotics. They lose their efficacy. You must finish the entire prescription so that you kill off all the disease in your system. Whereas, taking partial doses results in them not being as effective in the future, or not even working at all.

Another "no-no" is sharing your medications (no matter if it is an antibiotic or any other medication). You really do not know what a person is allergic to and our bodies are ever changing, so your allergic responses change. We can develop allergies as we age to things including medications that may not have bothered us at all as a child. So save yourself and others the trouble and don't share medications.

Also, a little side note: a virus, such as the common cold or the flu, do not benefit from antibiotics. Antibiotics are for bacterial disease processes (such as urinary tract infections, upper respiratory infections, dental infections, etc.). In some cases, a doctor may prescribe antibiotics when you have a virus for a potential secondary bacterial infection that could develop, but may not. They can be used prophylactically (which basically means prevention of infections - that's why people get antibiotics intravenously before/during surgeries or procedures).

Basically, be compliant and listen to your doctor's advice and take all your own medications and take antibiotics until all gone!!

The only medication we are allowed to share is LAUGHTER! It IS the best medicine and does a body good. 😊
