From my heart to yours:

New Building and Renovation

Members of the church staff have moved into our offices in the new building. We are still getting settled and some furnishings and equipment from the old offices are still finding a home. Drop in for a visit. We are ready to show you around. We are waiting to finish renovation of the old offices into attractive, functional classrooms before we have a dedication service. Hopefully, this will take place in November.

Prayer Ministry

Our church has had a prayer ministry for quite a number of years. We take seriously the words of Jesus, "My house will be called a house of prayer" (Matthew 21:13). S. D. Gordon once said, "You can do more than pray after you have prayed; but you can do no more than pray until you have prayed." I am aware of several prayer groups that meet in homes. Folks gather and quietly go about the practice of prayer on a weekly basis.

Our church also has a prayer room. Previously it was located at the back of our educational building. Now it has a prominent place in the new Office Building adjacent to the front door, with its own entrance. It is a warm, prayerful environment.

According to its stated mission, "The Prayer Ministry of Barcelona Road Baptist Church exists to glorify God by elevating prayer to its rightful place of priority and visibility within the church; by testifying to the community around us of our faith in a God of grace and power Who 'is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine'; by helping our members to grow in faith and obedience to God's will; by undergirding all the other ministries of the church and denomination with spiritual power; and by touching the world in a purposeful, powerful and positive way through prayer."

How can you participate in our prayer room ministry? You can choose an hour each week to come to the prayer room for a time of prayer. Members and guests fill out prayer cards each Sunday; and we also receive telephone calls requesting prayer. These requests are kept in the prayer room and maintained on a confidential basis. Audio, Video, and Projection Volunteers Needed What do you see and hear from your seat in Sunday Morning Worship? You see and hear the welcome and announcements, the children's moment, the deacon of the day, the music, including the choir and pianist, and the sermon. What is it you do not see or hear? You do not see or hear what is happening on the front row of the balcony. During the service, several faithful folks are involved behind the scenes enhancing our worship experience. We have three teams doing their work: audio, video recording, and video projection.

The audio team is responsible for the placement of microphones and the projection of sound so we can hear. One or more members of the team are stationed at the sound board for the Sunday morning and night services, prayer meeting, weddings and funerals, and other special occasions. Currently, Irey Dallas, Glenn Grippe, and Dennis Russell serve on this team. Occasionally, Lloyd Chapman, a dedicated worker from the past, is at the board. Glenn Grippe also oversees the audio reinforcement for the Celebration Service in Fellowship Hall.

The video recording team is responsible for our two camera operation (hopefully the preacher doesn't pace off camera!), transmission of the sermon to the big screen for the Celebration Service, the video recording of the service for posterity, and the uplink of the service to our website. Members of this team include Tony Gaston, Damian LaFargue, and Lloyd Thrash. Al Stout primarily has been responsible for website production. The team also is called in for weddings and funerals and other special occasions.

The video projection team is composed of Carolyn Gaston, Ron Kunath, BJ Robinson, and Lloyd Thrash. This team provides wonderful reinforcement to Sunday Morning Worship by what you see on the screens: the welcome and announcements, the words to the hymns sung by the congregation and special music by the choir and soloists, the sermon notes, and beautiful and meaningful art work to illustrate the theme of the service. At present, Carolyn Gaston is the primary person doing this important work, with others on the team in occasional back-up roles. BJ Robinson takes care of the Celebration Service.

We need volunteers in all these areas. Will you agree to serve? Those on board now are willing and ready to help train you. Looking for a refreshing, healthy, heart smart treat? Try this!

Blueberry Banana Yogurt Pops

In a blender or food processor, combine until smooth: 2/3 cup blueberries 3/4 cup low-fat plain Greek yogurt 1 ripe banana

Measure another 1/3 cup blueberries and place at the bottom of 4 small paper cups.

Spoon the yogurt mixture evenly into the cups.

Top with remaining blueberries. Place a wooden stick (tongue depressor, or plastic spoon) in each cup and freeze.

To serve, peel off the paper cup. Allow the pops to soften for 5-10 minutes.

(Gains: 2 grams protein and 2 grams fiber. Lose: 4 grams sugar - including high fructose corn syrup and cane sugar)

You can substitute the blueberries with any berry of your choice!

He describes himself as shy, quiet and funny.


His favorite television show is <u>Animaniacs</u> and his favorite movie is <u>Alice and The</u> Wonder Land.
