

Sermon on the Mount Series

A Testimony of Faith by a Scientist

I ran across this statement of faith by Dr. Werner Von Braun, the great space scientist. It expresses the certainty of our Christian hope.

"Many people seem to feel that science has somehow made religious ideas untimely and old-fashioned. But I think science has a real surprise for the skeptic. Science for instance tells us that nothing in nature, not even the tiniest particle, can disappear without a trace. Nature does not know extinction. All it knows is transformation. Now If God applies this fundamental principle to the most minute and insignificant part of His universe, doesn't it make sense to assume that He applies it also to the human soul? I think it does. Everything science has taught me and continues to teach me strengthens my belief in the continuity of our spiritual existence after death. Nothing disappears without a trace."

A total of \$4,648.00 has been raised for the youth trip to Ark Encounter and Creation Museum in Tennessee June 20-26.














