FROM MY HEART TO YOURS:

Thankful Hearts

As Thanksgiving Day approaches, I like to recall a story from Benjamin

Franklin's boyhood. He told about the old salt barrel that stood in the corner of the kitchen. Meat was taken from the barrel daily to provide for the family's needs. Franklin's father prayed at every meal: "Thank thee, Father, for the meat thou hast laid before us." One day young Ben mustered enough courage to suggest: "Father, why don't we say thanks over the whole barrel at once and be done with it?" Commenting on this experience years later, Franklin said he would never forget the stern rebuke of his father for such presumptuous ingratitude.

We observe Thanksgiving Day once each year. We dump the blessings of 364 days into one Thanksgiving Day and express our gratitude to God. It would be more appropriate to set aside one day each year for grumbling and complaining and reserve the remaining 364 days for thanksgiving. We need to remember to be thankful not just now but throughout the year.

The writer of Deuteronomy shares an important word. It was addressed to the Israelites at the time of their conquest of the "When you have eaten and Promised Land. are satisfied, praise the Lord your God for the good land he has given you. Be careful that you do not forget the Lord your God, failing to observe his commands, his laws, and his decrees that I am giving you this day. Otherwise, when you eat and are satisfied, when you build fine houses and settle down, and when your herds and flocks grow large and your silver and gold increase and all that you have is multiplied, then your hearts will become proud and you forget the Lord your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery.

He then continues: "You may say to yourself, 'My power and the strength of my hands have produced this wealth for me.' But remember the Lord your God, for it is he who gives you the ability to produce wealth, and so confirms his covenant which he swore to your forefathers, as it is today" (Deuteronomy 8:10-14, 17-18).

As we consider the importance of expressing our gratitude to God for His blessings, may we

ponder profitably and prayerfully these words: "Bless the Lord, O my soul; and all that is within me, bless his holy name. Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits" (Psalm 103:1-2).

What are these "benefits?" The list is endless but surely must include our lives, health, strength, family, church, work, and most of all, salvation which has come to us by grace and through faith in Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.

We should remember to take life with gratitude and not for granted! English author, G. K. Chesterton remarked that at a difficult time in his life when he was prone to doubt and despair, what kept him going was "one thin thread of thanks." But that is enough!

<u>The Edelweiss Sisters</u> by Kate Hewitt - Before World War II sisters Johanna, Birgit and Lotte live a simple life in Salzburg with their clock-mending father and housewife mother. Although they are siblings close in age, they have very different characters. Each one has a different reaction to the unfolding situation and chooses to navigate her own path during the War, learning from her experiences and dealing with the consequences of her actions.

Sandy Cove Series by Susanna O'Leary -

Secrets of Willow House: A heartwarming and moving story about secrets, fresh starts and the power of friendship, set in the wilds of Ireland's shores. In desperate need of a time-out, Maeve McKenna visits her Aunt Philomena in Sandy Cove, where she once, as a teenager, kissed a wild, mysterious boy - a kiss she has never been able to forget. Roisin heads to Sandy Cove to help Maeve restore their aunt's gorgeous tumbledown mansion Willow House and soon all she has time to focus on are its crumbling walls. Despite a shocking announcement from Maeve and hidden secrets in the house's rafters, Roisin begins to feel a sense of self she's been missing for years.

Dreams of Willow House: Cordelia Mirafiore has never truly felt at home in South Florida, so when she's unexpectedly called to the reading of a long-lost relative's will in Ireland, she's hopeful that escaping to Willow House to meet her family might help her to figure out who she really is. As soon as Cordelia reaches Sandy Cove, the views of the blue ocean and stunning coastline around her provide a sense of calm she has never felt before. She meets her cousins Maeve and Roisin, who welcome her with open arms, finds herself drawn to a handsome man who is also an outsider in town, and feels an instant spark.
